# County Approves Speed Tables for Coral Gate

Over the last two years members of the Coral Gate Homeowners Association have been asking the City of Miami and Miami-Dade County to move forward with a traffic calming project in Coral Gate. The initiative was born out of the February 2013 General Meeting during which Coral Gate residents signed a petition confirming that speeding cars were negatively affecting their safety and well-being.

Since then the CGHA has provided a lot of feedback to the City and County on different possible designs for the devices and locations where speeding most often occurs. The "traffic tables" located on Key Biscayne, for example, were provided as the model for the devices that would best calm traffic while at the same time be attractive. Details like type of surface materials and speed table height were evaluated, again using Key Biscayne as the example. Examples were also provided to the City of devices that we would wish not to be installed in the neighborhood because they are ineffective.

The City has since obtained approval from the County to construct traffic tables at three separate locations within the neighborhood: 20th Street, 32 Court and 16th Terrace. Installation should start in November 2014.
